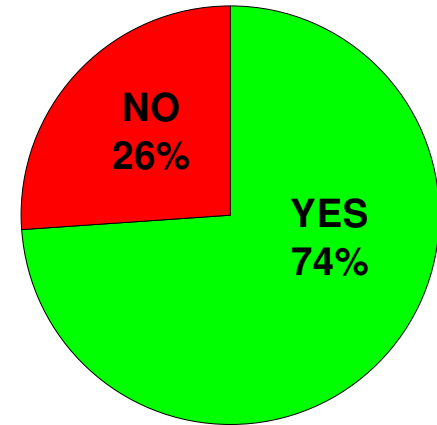
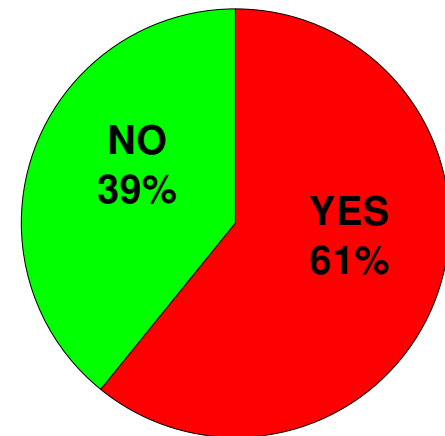

- **Question No. 1** - Does your well provide a sufficient amount of water to meet your daily family needs?

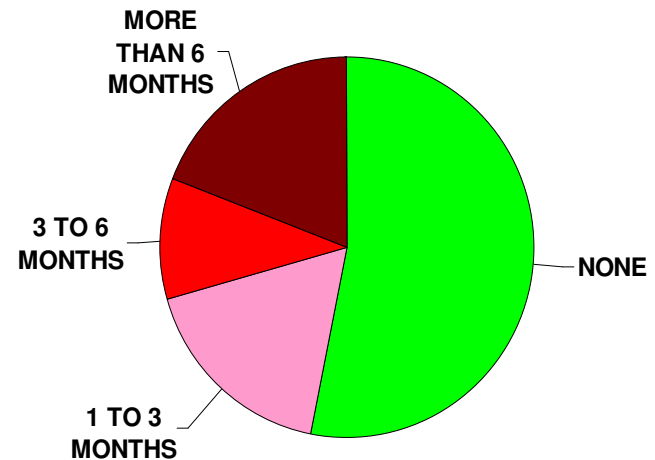


- **Question No. 2** - Do you use bottled water for personal, drinking or cooking purposes?

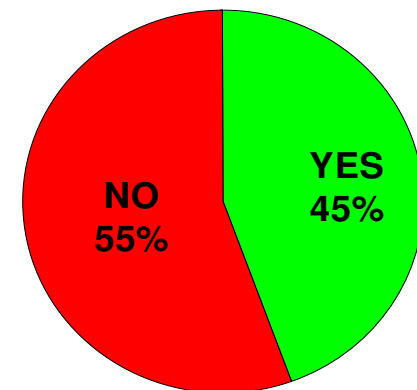

- **Question No. 3** - How many months during the year is your well water unsatisfactory?

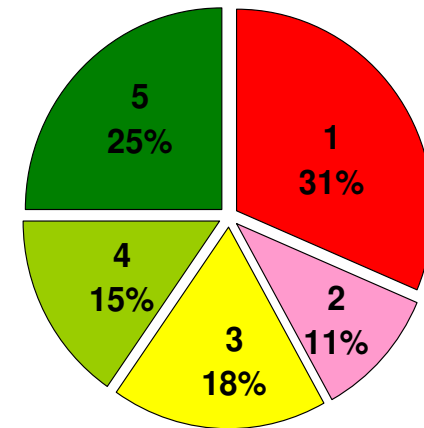


- **Question No. 4** - Have you had your well tested for E. coli or other contaminants?

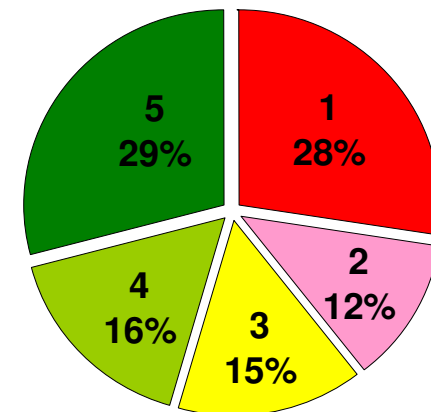

- **Question No. 5a** - On a scale of 1 to 5, please rate the quality of your water based on taste (poor 1 - 5 excellent)

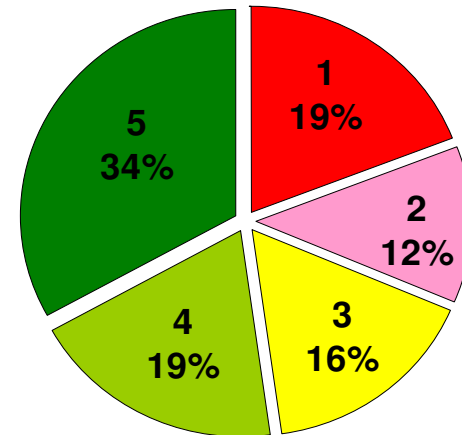


- **Question No. 5b** - On a scale of 1 to 5, please rate the quality of your water based on odor (poor 1 - 5 excellent)

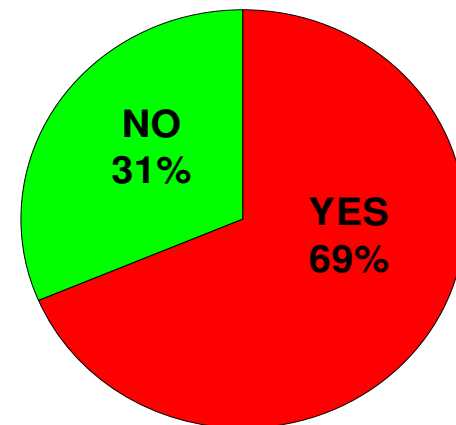

- **Question No. 5c** - On a scale of 1 to 5, please rate the quality of your water based on color (poor 1 - 5 excellent).

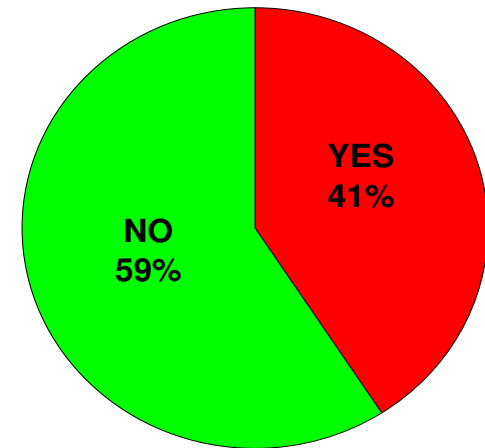

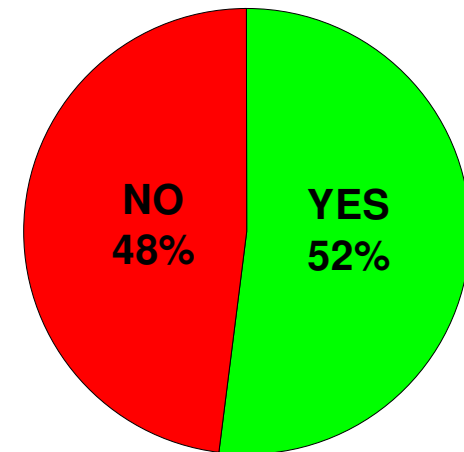

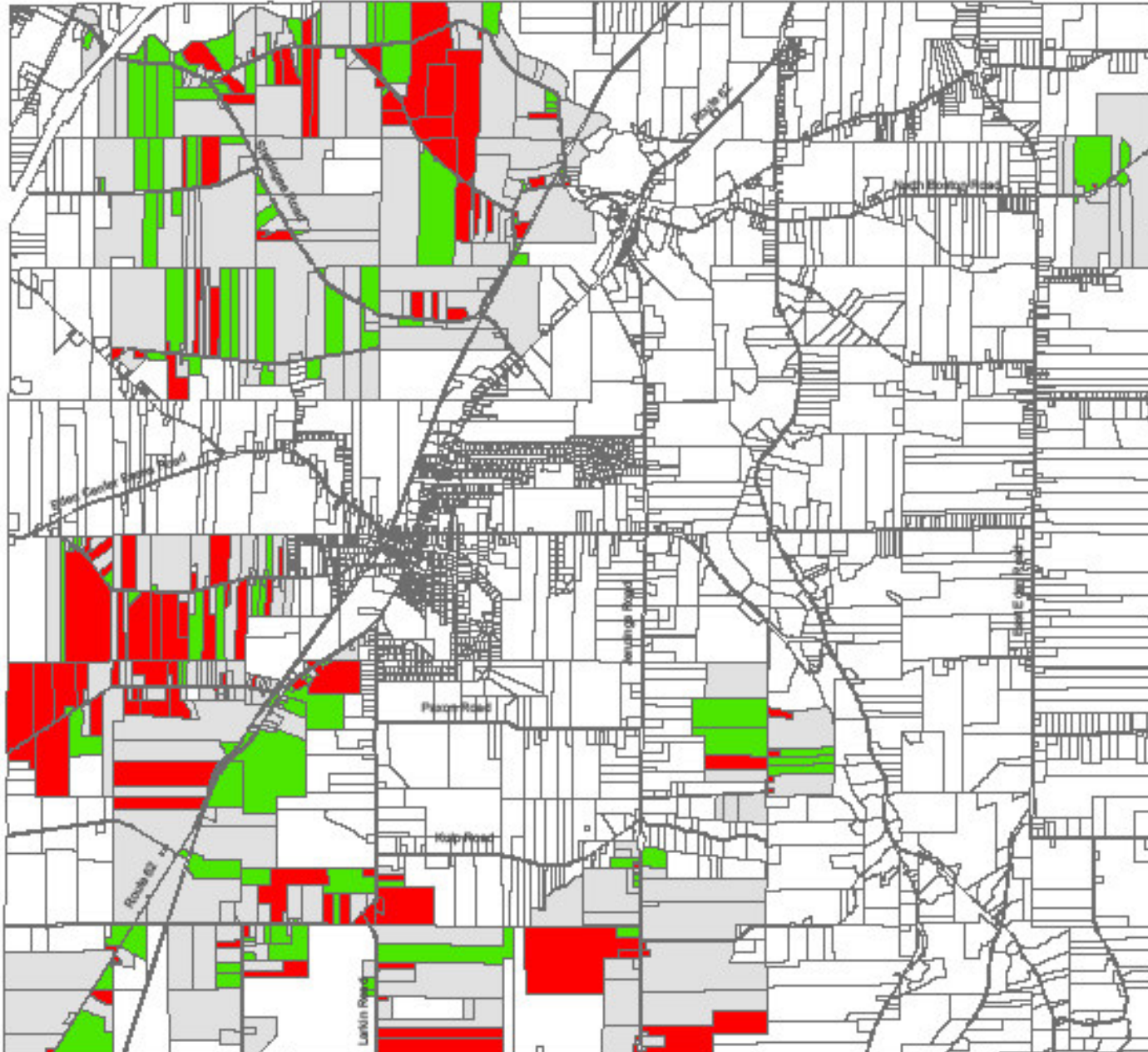
- **Question No. 7** - Have you, or do you anticipate, spending money on your well system related to maintenance and/or treatment, or supplementing your well by having water delivered by truck?
